Description:

This seminar focuses on post-WWII American films made about or for teenagers and adolescents. The changing conceptions of aging, maturity, and American identity on screen form the crux of our discussion, and the course explores these topics in relation to race and rituals of belonging, sexuality and body horror, and the commodification of youth and American identity.

Course requirements:

As this is a one-credit course, your primary obligations will be attendance, participation, and three very short responses of a couple sentences to films or readings under discussion during the semester. Secondary readings will total approximately 30 pp. per week.

Films:

We will view a film for each decade starting with the 1950's. We have picked the first four films, and we want you to choose our final two films from the 90's and 00's. We'll vote once the course gets rolling. Candidates:

90's - Bill and Ted's Bogus Journey (1991), Boys N the Hood (1991), Clueless (1995), Ten Things I Hate About You (1999), American Pie (1999), Cruel Intentions (1999), Election (1999), Varsity Blues (1999)

00's - The Virgin Suicides (2000), Mean Girls (2004), Brick (2005), Superbad (2007), American Teen (2008), Easy A (2010), Scott Pilgrim vs. the World (2010), 21 Jump Street (2012), Pitch Perfect (2012), The Perks of Being a Wallflower (2012)
